- Food pantry is still in place and is still utilizing space outside of fire barn, electric is still temporary and plug will be completed soon.
- Budget has been submitted
- Transparency notice has been sent out to Jessica Brookhart

The Budget was discussed in regards to the following:

• Expense account will be turned over to Chief with Jess Brookhart to have access.

New/ Other Business

- Forest Restoration project is still in place, the board will need to start working with Maya regarding what information to provide to the public and will need some board members to be present for a town hall meeting to field questions with Maya. In addition the fire department will need to start communicating with Four Mile and Maya regarding what role Gold Hill can play to assist in the mitigation efforts.
- Kris Gibson is waiting on Sam login for applying to AFG grant
- Questions regarding what grants are being looked at and what equipment we need. Current attention will be placed on acquiring Bunker Gear for volunteers.
- The Internet will be hooked up to the fire barn by next week.
- GIS collector application will continue to be researched as a way the town could better prepare, preplan, and map.
- Request was made by Deb Yeagar for the fire truck parked on Pine Street to be moved to allow for a plow truck to plow.
